Timeline for Return to In-Person Instruction by Grade Level

The timeline for return to in-person instruction offers a phased approach for students to access additional in-person learning and become accustomed to safety protocols and new routines arriving at and leaving school. This timeline also accommodates the continued access to two-dose vaccination schedules by teachers and staff. Vaccinations for PVUSD's 2,432 staff began in early February and a final group received their first doses the last weekend in February. The delayed timeline considered the high case rates in PVUSD boundaries and its continued declining trajectory.

SECONDARY SCHEDULES BY GRADE LEVEL

Multiple factors from three parent surveys, teacher feedback and hybrid pilots at six schools were used to solidify the schedules. Prioritizing health and safety, consistency of routines, maintaining their current teacher and continued daily interaction were priorities among stakeholders. The optional hybrid mode will preserve these priorities and offers extra instructional time each week. Families desiring distance-only learning for their students may continue without the additional in-person instruction. Students currently attending Safe Spaces will continue to receive that service and will participate in in-person instruction. Teachers providing in-person instruction will not have office hours Tuesday to Friday.

COVID-19 Safety Tools



Symptom Screening: Daily screening for COVID-19 symptoms and exposure before arriving at school is required. Students and parents will use the Five Star app as a daily reminder. The app can be accessed on a Chromebook or phone.



Surveillance Testing: PVUSD will conduct COVID-19 surveillance testing on all in-person staff every two weeks while Santa Cruz County is in the red tier.



PVUSD School COVID-19 Readiness: Individual site <u>readiness index</u> includes Maintenance and Operations, Purchasing, Technology, Food Services, Transportation and Risk Management.



COVID-19 Prevention Plan (CPP): This plan will include the Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Prevention Program (CPP). The CPP will also include the COVID-19 School Guidance Checklist. The CPP will be shared with community forums for input on March 16. The CSP will be posted by March 31. Hard copies will be available in your school's office.



COVID-19 Dashboard: All confirmed positive COVID-19 incidents related to Pajaro Valley Unified School District will be posted on the District's webpage. For the purposes of this Dashboard, PVUSD is providing district-wide numbers of confirmed cases and work-related transmissions in students and staff. The COVID Dashboard will go live on April 5 and will be updated on a regular basis.

Student Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

PVUSD will provide required PPE in accordance with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) guidance. All students in all grade levels Preschool - 12 and staff are required to wear face coverings at all times, while at school, unless exempted under CDPH guidelines. These CDPH guidelines further require that schools must exclude students from campus if they are not exempt from wearing a face covering and refuse to wear one provided by the school.

Initial distribution of 2-3 reusable cloth masks per student provided; disposable masks available when needed at school



Desk barriers

A desk barrier will be placed on each student's desk as an added protection layer
